Principal's Report - Ceilidh and Catrina

- It's been a great start back to school following Spring Break
- Thursday, April 10 is early dismissal for informal reporting
 - o Informal reporting happens Twice per year between report cards
 - o Parent teacher interviews are no longer mandated
- Friday, April 11 is a Pro-D Day; no school
- Dance club will be doing a fundraiser for upcoming performance costs
 - o Students will be selling Rice Krispy squares, Bubly drinks, and chips in coming weeks
- Created by Kids fundraiser is in progress

- Some classroom's art may be ready in time to send home on Thursday
- Emergency kit fundraiser ongoing; deadline to order is April 11 via Hot Lunch website
- April 15: Sangster will have a fine arts assembly
 - Choir and dance "rehearsals" ahead of upcoming public performances
- April 15: Kindergarten Read and Ride event for incoming Kindergarten students
- Kindergarten orientations coming up in May; separate dates for regular and Nature K
- April 23: Admin Assistant Day
- April 24: Spring cross country event
 - Split into two dates this year; less congestion at JDF
 - Spectators will be contained to one specific area for safety
- Planning ahead for 2025-2026 school year
 - Sangster will have one more division
 - o Currently 309 students registered for 2024-2025; next year currently 333 are registered
 - This means that Sangster's "flex space" (currently used for music) will be needed for a regular classroom
 - Our music program will look a little bit different next year, but Mr. Poynter is confident that he can continue to provide quality music education to our students
 - The addition of another division will also mean that PE, prep, and library time will also increase
 - Scheduling will be strategic to ensure that all available space is being utilized
 - There will be three job postings are going out for grades 1-2 split, grades 2-3 split, and grade 4
 - Library position will likely also be posted
 - o Ceilidh will send a classroom placement request email to go out to families by May 2
 - Sangster will receive two new administrative staff for next year
 - Krista Leakey from Sooke Elementary as Sangster's new Principal
 - Shawn Taal from Colwood Elementary as Sangster's new Vice Principal
